
State Budget

- Overall Budget Proposed at \$60B including roads proposal
 - Tax proposals EITC, pension, pass-through business entities
- Constitutional Revenue Sharing Sales Tax Growth \$27.5M
- CVTRS / Statutory Revenue Sharing Increased 3% (\$7.7M)
 - \$5M Community Opportunities for Renewal grant program
- Drinking water protection & innovation investments \$120M
 - \$37.5M for lead & copper rule
 - \$30M PFAS abatement/clean-up
 - \$40M DWRF loan forgiveness




State Budget - Road Funding


- Governor Proposes Bold Plan to Fix Michigan's Roads
- Three Key Tenets of the Proposal
 - 1. Sustainable Long Term Solution
 - Return State Roads to 90% Good and Fair Condition
 - Targeted Investment
 - 2. Replace Diversion from the General Fund with Constitutionally Protected Revenues for Roads
 - Increases the Gas Tax by 45 Cents
 - 3. Provide Tax Offset to Mitigate the Impact for Low Income Families
 - Doubles Earned Income Tax Credit

Road Funding

- Raises the Gas tax 45 Cents by October 2021
 - Phased-In Over 12 Months in Three 15-cent Increments
 - Increase Gas and Diesel Taxes from 26.3 cents to 71.3 cents
 - Index to Inflation
- Generates \$2.5 billion in new Fuel Tax Revenue
- \$2.137 Billion in New Road Funding
- New Funding Formula
 - Focuses Resources on the Most Highly-Traveled and Economically Important Roads



Road Funding

- The Bottom Line
 - There Are No Easy Solutions
 - The Problem is Big
 - The Solution Required is Equally as Big
 - Significant New Revenue is Needed
 - Inaction No Longer an Option
 - Bold Action Is Required
