Statutory Revenue Sharing

Governor's Proposal

- City, Village, and Township Revenue Sharing total increase is \$29.4 million (10% Increase)
 - \$14.7 million ongoing (5%)
 - \$8.8 million related to the one-time local fiscal recovery fund incentive (3%)
 - \$5.9 million one-time related to public safety (2%)
- \$55M Total Increase (Includes Counties)





Revenue Sharing Trust Fund: HB 4274 & 4275

- 1. Creates the Revenue Sharing Trust Fund and dedicates 8% of the 4% sales tax to statutory revenue sharing
- 2. Creates a new funding category that would restore payments to 1091 townships and 44 villages
- 3. Remaining balance would be distributed to the CVTs and counties currently receiving statutory revenue sharing payments in the same proportion and the FY23/24 budget

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New Short-Term Rental Legislation HB 5438

- 1. This is not a preemption amendment to the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act
- 2. Local units of government maintain authority to regulate short-term rentals
- 3. An opt-in statewide excise tax is created (6% of the STR occupancy rate) and proceeds will be distributed to the local unit of government in which the STR is located
