



Recycling was designated as an **essential service** in 2020


The **global recycling system** is valued at over **\$200B** per year

Project Drawdown estimates that recycling between 2020 and 2050 will reduce emissions by 5.5 to 6.02 gigatons of carbon dioxide, equivalent to taking over one billion cars off the streets for one year






WE RECYCLE ABOUT 23% OF OUR MSW STREAM




MORE THAN HALF OF MICHIGAN'S Traditional Materials RECYCLING RATE IS A DIRECT RESULT OF STATE POLICY!

- Recycling will create \$33.8B in economic output





Support diversion programming & infrastructure








WHY DROP-OFFS?

1/2 of Michigan's materials fall outside of what's captured in traditional programs

Adding 100 super drop-offs would reach 98% of the population but even more drop-offs are needed to make recycling convenient





EXTENDED PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY

A policy approach that makes producers responsible for the impacts of their products along the entire lifecycle.




