The City has compiled a list of resources to assist residents during the Coronavirus outbreak.

The information provided was accurate as of March 18th but given the fluidity of the situation, we encourage you to call and confirm if the following resources are still available as described.

GROCERIES

For residents who do not want to enter a store to purchase groceries, the following options are available:

- Holiday Market in Royal Oak offers online ordering at www.holiday-market.com
- Kroger in Royal Oak offers online ordering at https://www.kroger.com/i/ways-to-shop/pickup. Items may be picked up or delivered for a fee.

We can also make arrangements for volunteers to deliver groceries to you after an online order is filled. Call Jen Furlong to arrange for a grocery delivery.

PRESCRIPTIONS

For residents who do not want to enter a store to pick up a prescription, the following options are available:

- Lincoln Drugs can deliver medication at no cost. Call 248.543.7848 for arrangements.
- Rite-Aid Drug is developing a drop-off program. Call them at 248.545.8020 if interested.

If someone else is going to pick up a prescription on your behalf, phone the pharmacy ahead of time and advise them so they are aware.

TRANSPORATION NEEDS

For essential transportation needs, you can make an appointment to ride the Smart Connector. Call 866.962.5515 to make an appointment.

If you want to use a ride sharing program like Uber or Lyft, you can call GoGo Grandparent, set up an account and they will make the arrangements for you. Call GoGo Grandparent at 855.464.6872 The City is offering a discount for first-time users.

Myride2 is a service that helps seniors and adults with disabilities in Oakland, Macomb, Washtenaw, and Wayne counties find transportation. Need a ride? They will help you coordinate your transportation options. You can call them at 855.MyRide2 or go online at www.myride2.com.
