










Main Street Microgrant Regions

Applications

- April 30 through May 31
- Separate applications for each category
- Demonstrate feasibility, partnership, and creativity

- Community-driven, bottom-up approach
- Impact
- Inclusion
- Celebration
- Unification
- Safety precautions for COVID-19







Forming Your Application Team

MUST HAVE:

- 3 (or more!) locally-owned business within a 4-blocks of one another
- At least one artist
- Optional: DDA/Commercial Association/Chamber of Commerce





Semi-Finalists & Voting

- 4 semi-finalists per region will be selected & notified
- Voting will take place online
- Voting allowed once per day per person



How Projects will be Scored

Process



Step 1: Internal Review



Step 2: Public Voting



Step 3: External Review

Criteria

- Innovation and Creativity
- Community Impact
- Addresses Equity Issues in Community
- Overall Feasibility
- Weighted Votes



Keep it Legal

Main Street Microgrants

- MUST secure letter of support from local unit of government
- Most projects will require permits of some kind
- Please secure all proper permits if you are awarded. Start talking to your local planning/zoning staff now.
