The essays will be judged by the Michigan Municipal League. Essays will be judged on creativity, clarity, sincerity of thought, and proper use of grammar and spelling.

The winning students will receive complimentary conference registration to the League's Annual Capital Conference, March 25, 2015, at the Lansing Center in Lansing, Michigan. Registration covers the cost of session attendance, entrance in the expohall, and lunch on March 25, 2015.
